

MEMORIAL RESOLUTION

JUDGE HENRY S. WISE

July 16, 1909 to March 16, 1982

The death of Senior District Judge Henry Wise on March 16, 1982 ended a long, useful, and distinguished career in state government and the federal judiciary.

Judge Wise was born in Mount Carmel, Illinois on July 16, 1909. He attended St. Mary's Grade School and Mount Carmel High School. At Mount High School he played on the basketball team which won the state tournament when he was a senior.

He attended Washington University in St. Louis from 1923 to 1930 receiving his A.B. and LL.B. degrees. His interests in sports continued both at Washington University and in playing semi-professional sports when he returned to his home in Illinois. His long love of sports was exemplified by his unwillingness to ever take a vacation during the state basketball tournament.

Judge Wise started work in his father's meat market in Mount Carmel. He worked with children on the St. Louis playgrounds and at the Washington University cafeteria in order to put himself through school.

After his admission to the Bar in the State of Illinois, he worked in Danville as a private practitioner and as a member of several local law firms.

He served as a Commissioner on the Illinois Court of Claims from 1949 to 1953 and on the Illinois Parole and Pardon Board from 1961 to 1966. He was appointed District Judge for the then Eastern District of Illinois and entered on duty on October 10, 1966. He served as Chief Judge from April 26, 1972 until March 31, 1978 at which time he took senior judge status.

Judge Wise was married to the former G. Louise Hawkins who predeceased him. He is survived by his five children H. Michael Wise, Patricia L. Wise Satre, N. Susanne Wise Lang, Marilyn J. Wise Furnish and David W. Wise and thirteen grandchildren.

Until illness curtailed his judicial activities, Judge Wise was "The Federal Judge" to the residents and members of the bar in the Danville area. He represented the federal judiciary

with dignity and distinction and is remembered with respect and affection by his fellow judges, by the lawyers who appeared before him, and by the members of this Association.

Be it resolved that this memorial shall be spread upon the records of the Bar Association of the Seventh Federal Circuit and transmitted to his children.
