



IU Buildings: Remediation updates

This site includes the latest information regarding removing and resolving mold concerns in some residence halls on the Bloomington campus.

Not receiving messages about the remediation effort?

Students should check their settings for IU-Notify alerts by going to one.iu.edu, searching for IU-Notify and verifying their mobile number and email address are correct. Residents are receiving email and text messages about remediation work involving their rooms, including the cleaning schedule, via the IU-Notify system. If the student's information is not in the system or the student has opted out of IU-Notify alerts, student will not receive these important messages.

Testing: Every room and common area in residence halls with heightened concern are being tested for mold spores by a third party.

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Update Jan. 11, 4:28 p.m.

The vast majority of laundry from RPS residents sent to FLIP Laundry Services is in the possession of the service's Indianapolis facility meaning it was not affected by the fire this morning at the Bloomington location. All of this laundry will be completed and returned on Monday as scheduled.

FLIP Laundry Service will not be available for the foreseeable future, however, given the damage the Bloomington facility sustained this morning. Any bags of laundry recently delivered to the center desk for cleaning should be picked up and will need to be laundered by the student.

IU will extend the RPS laundry credit for Teter residents through 11:59 p.m. Jan. 31, 2019.

Update Jan. 11, 10:27 a.m.

For several weeks, students living in Foster, McNutt and Teter have had access to FLIP Laundry Services as an additional resources for handling clothes and belongings affected by mold. Unfortunately early this morning, there was a fire at FLIP Laundry Services, which means the business will be closed for the foreseeable future. We are awaiting word from FLIP on the current status of items that were in their care.

Update Jan. 2, 8:34 p.m.

As students begin to return to campus, a few reminders to Teter residents:

- All inspections, cleaning and air sampling were completed over winter break. Every Teter resident should have received an email on Dec. 28 regarding the result of the air sample of their room. This email also provided information on any next steps students need to take regarding their housing accommodations for the spring semester. Residents may also check the Status Check site at any time for the air sample results.
- If a resident's room was not packed as instructed prior to leaving for winter break, RPS staff packed the

resident's belongings so inspections and cleaning could be completed. Belongings will be boxed in the student's room.

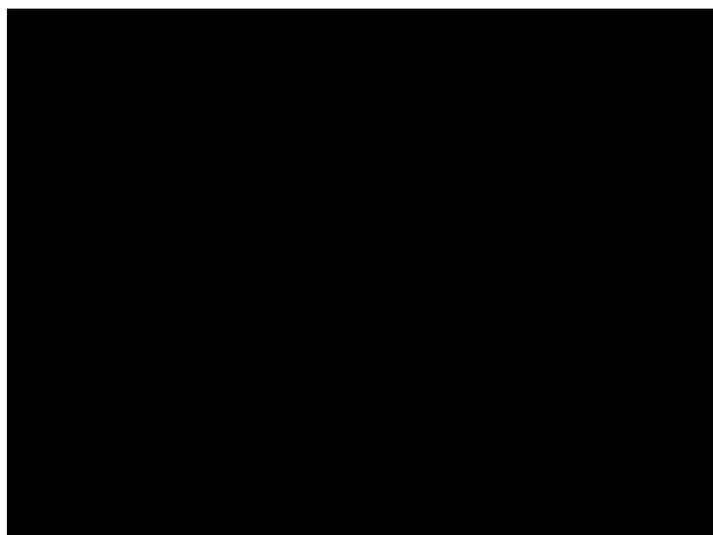
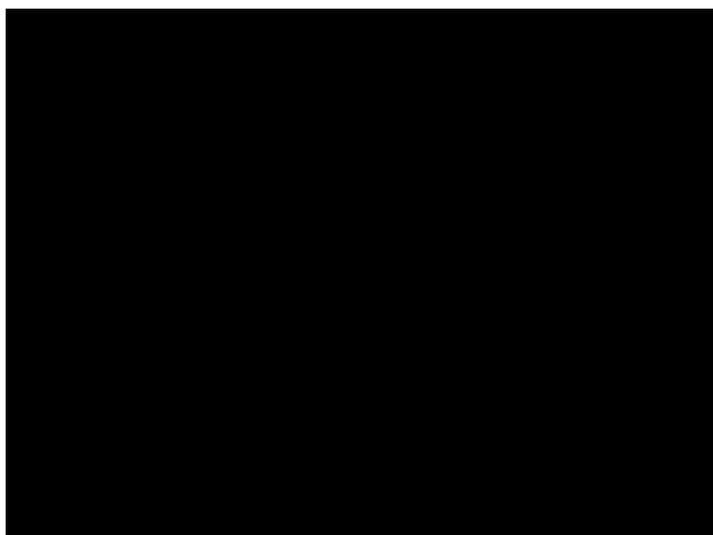

Teter residents will receive an email this afternoon letting them know if the score for their room is in the green (low), orange (moderate) or red (high) category.
