

Complications Atelectasis is also a possible complication of other respiratory Preparing for your problems, including cystic fibrosis, inhaled foreign objects, lung appointment tumors, fluid in the lung, respiratory weakness and chest injuries. Tests and diagnosis The amount of lung tissue involved in atelectasis is variable, Treatments and drugs depending on the cause. Atelectasis can make breathing difficult and lower oxygen particularly if lung disease is already present. Prevention Treatment depends on the cause and severity of the collapse.
