There are **1,349 federal inmates** and **163 B confirmed positive test results for COVID-19 nationwide**. Currently, **4,975** inmates and **528** staff l been **87** federal inmate deaths and **1** BOP staff member death attributed to COVID-19 disease.

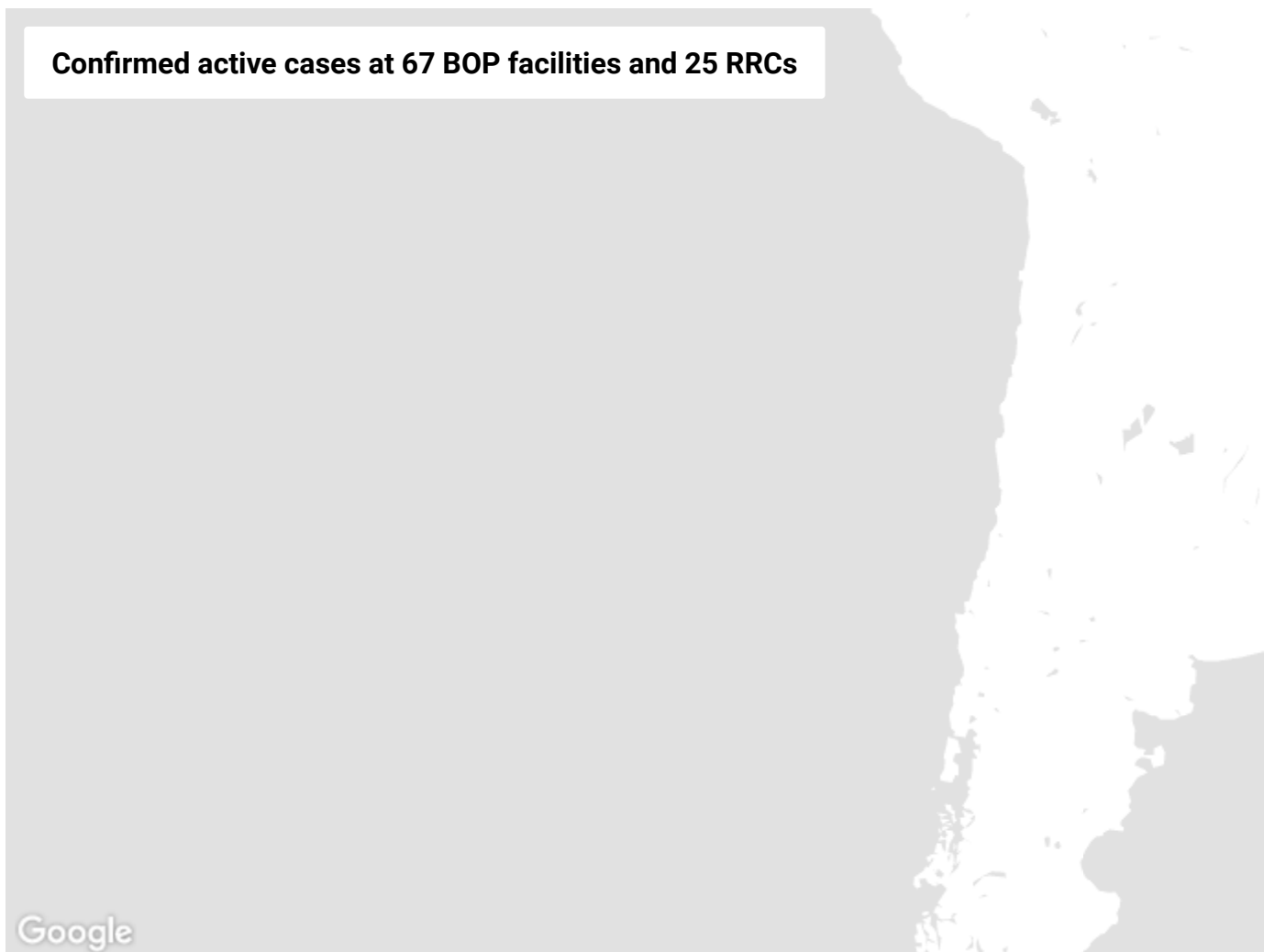
Due to the rapidly evolving nature of this public health crisis, the BOP will update the open COVID-19 confirmed posi and the number of COVID-19 related deaths daily at 3:00 p.m. The positive test numbers are based on the most rece **results** involving **open cases** from across the agency as reported by the BOP's Office of Occupational Health and Saf BOP field sites may report additional updates throughout the day. The BOP has begun additional testing of asymptomatic inmates to assist in slowing transmissions within a correction reflects an increase in the number of COVID-19 positive tests reflected in the table below. The BOP is able to better u management of an outbreak at the relevant, affected facility.

which inmates are suitable for home confinement. Since the release of the [Attorney General's](#) Bureau of Prisons on March 26, 2020 instructing us to prioritize home confinement as an appropriate response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the BOP has placed an additional **4,414** inmates on home confinement; 1.5 percent.
