The Bureau of Prisons (BOP) is carefully monitoring the spread of the COVID-19 virus. As an emergency situation, we carefully assess how to best ensure the safety of staff, inmates :

BOP's Emergency Response

Every institution is like a small city and to cope with major emergencies or other significant interruptions of normal operations, they each have continuity of operations (COOP) plans that provide guidance to staff.

COVID-19 Cases

06/02/2020 - The BOP has **135,563** federal inmates in BOP-managed institutions and **12,487** in contract facilities. The BOP staff complement is approximately **36,000**. There are **1904 federal inmates** and **175 BOP staff** with confirmed positive test results for COVID-19 nationwide. Currently, **3631** inmates and **448** staff have been tested. There have been **71** federal inmate deaths and **0** BOP staff member deaths attributed to COVID-19 disease.

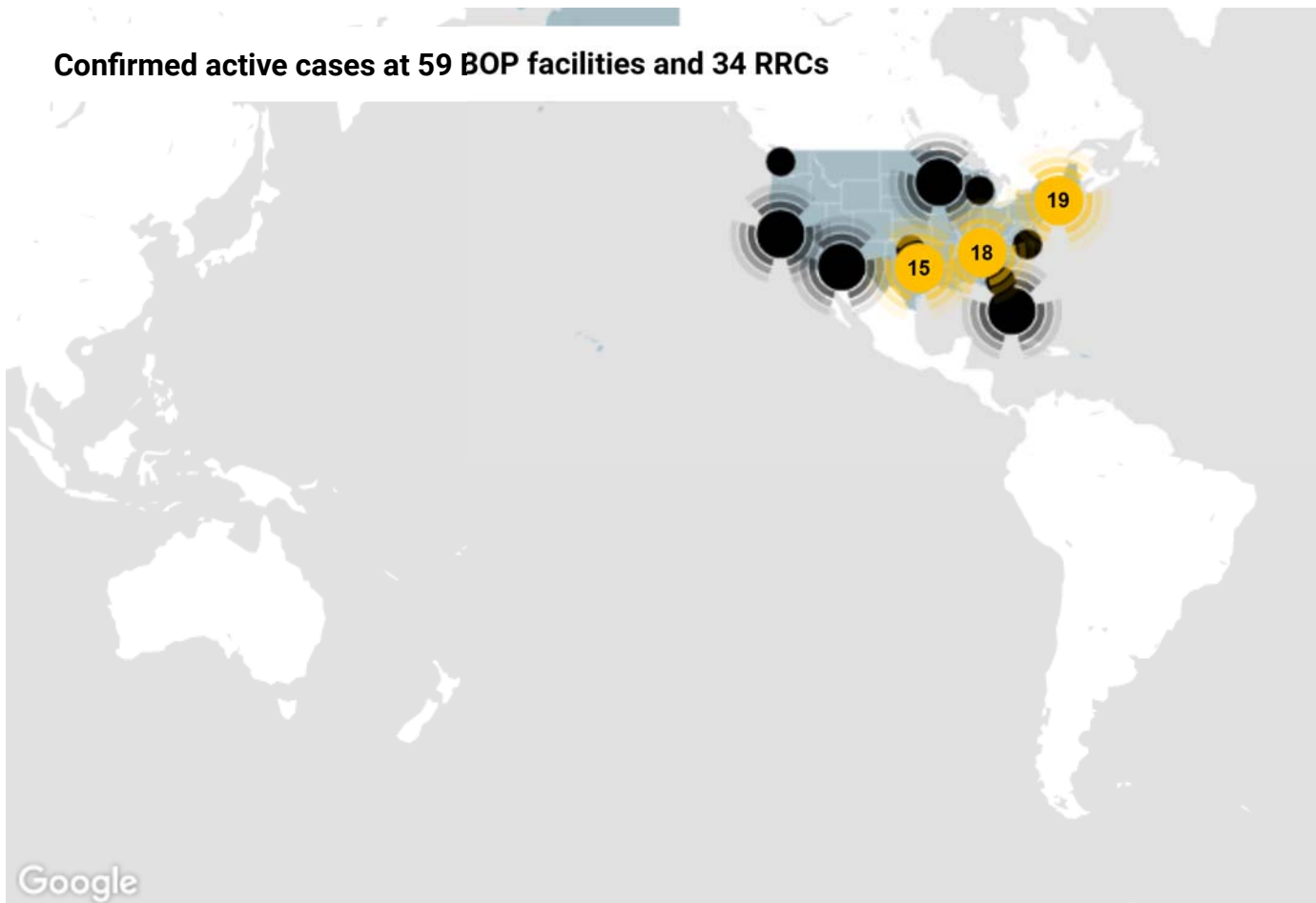
Due to the rapidly evolving nature of this public health crisis, the BOP will update the open COVID-19 confirmed positive test results and the number of COVID-19 related deaths daily at 3:00 p.m. The positive test numbers are based on the most recent **results** involving **open cases** from across the agency as reported by the BOP's Office of Occupational Health and Safety. BOP field sites may report additional updates throughout the day. Data is subject to change based on additional reporting.

The BOP has begun additional testing of asymptomatic inmates to assist in slowing transmissions within a correctional facility. This testing reflects an increase in the number of COVID-19 positive tests reflected in the table below. The BOP is able to better manage an outbreak at the relevant, affected facility.

The inmate totals listed do not include inmates participating in the Federal Location Monitoring program, inmates supervised by private contractors, or inmates being held in [privately managed prisons](#). Additionally, the reference to the FCI Butner Low below refers to an isolation unit separated from the rest of the LSCI.

COVID-19 Home Confinement Informatio

Given the surge in positive cases at select sites and in response to the Attorney General B. BOP began immediately reviewing all inmates who have COVID-19 risk factors, as describ determine which inmates are suitable for home confinement. Since the release of the [Attc original memo](#) to the Bureau of Prisons on March 26, 2020 instructing us to prioritize hon appropriate response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the BOP has placed an additional **3,610** confinement; an increase of **127** percent.
