

Legal Definition of *standing* (Entry 2 of 2)

1: the status of being qualified to assert or enforce legal rights or duties in a judicial forum because one has a sufficient and protectable interest in the outcome of a justiciable controversy and usually has suffered or is threatened with actual injury only one who already has standing can argue the public interest in support of his claim — *Hawaii's Thousand Friends v. Anderson*, 768 P.2d 1293 (1989)

2: a principle requiring that a party have standing in order to justify the exercise of the court's remedial powers


