<u>UW Health</u> is the integrated health system of the University of Wisconsin-Madison serving more than 600,000 patients each year in the Upper Midwest and beyond with approximately 1,750 physicians and 21,000 staff at seven hospitals and more than 80 outpatient sites. UW Health is governed by the <u>UW Hospitals and Clinics Authority</u> and partners with <u>UW School of Medicine and Public Health</u> to fulfill their patient care, research, education and community service missions.

<u>UW School of Medicine and Public Health</u> is the nation's only combined school of medicine and public health. Its 1,750 faculty in 10 basic science and 17 clinical departments engage in research, education and clinical care at UW Health's clinic locations, University Hospital, American Family Children's Hospital, UW Health at the American Center, UW Health Rehabilitation Hospital, other Madison hospitals and approximately 80 regional locations.

<u>UW Health</u> is a nationally recognized regional health system that includes:

- <u>University Hospital</u>, a 505-bed regional referral center that is home to a <u>Level One adult and pediatric trauma center</u>, American College of Surgeons-verified <u>Burn Center</u>, one of the nation's largest organ <u>transplant programs</u>, one of the nation's first <u>certified comprehensive stroke centers</u> and the <u>UW Carbone Cancer Center</u>, one of 41 National Cancer Institute-designated comprehensive centers in the country
- <u>UW Health at The American Center</u>, a 56-bed, community-based health and wellness facility
- American Family Children's Hospital, a nationally-ranked, 111-bed facility with pediatric and surgical neonatal intensive care unit

- <u>UW Health Rehabilitation Hospital</u>, a 50-bed, post-acute inpatient rehabilitation facility

- <u>Belvidere Medical Center</u>, a 34-bed inpatient/outpatient medical center
