authorization bill *n.* a bill brought before a legislature for the authorization of a specified item; (*U.S. Polit.*) a bill to establish, renew, or extend the legal authority for a government agency, programme, etc.

Though a United States authorization bill may recommend the level of funding for an agency or programme, the actual amount is determined by a subsequent appropriation bill.
