Medical Definition of *lavage* (Entry 1 of 2)

: the act or action of washing *especially* : the therapeutic washing out of an organ or part // gastric *lavage*

lavage transitive verb

lavaged; lavaging

Medical Definition of *lavage* (Entry 2 of 2)

1 : to wash or wash out therapeutically// lavaged the bladder with water

II the incisions were *lavaged* with sterile saline

2 : to perform lavage on
