 Definition of MIRROR

### Definition of MIRROR

- 1 : a polished or smooth surface (as of glass) that forms images by reflection
- 2 a : something that gives a true representation  
 b : an exemplary model  
 — mir·rored *adjective*  
 — mir·ror·like *adjective*

### Origin of MIRROR

Middle English *mirour*, from Anglo-French *mirur*, from *mīrer* to look at, from Latin *mirari* to wonder at  
 First Known Use: 13th century
